

- 4) About 33 girl students participated in 'Breast Feeding Awareness Programme'


4) Problem Encountered and Resource Required:-

- 9) In 'Rojgar Nokari Guidance Workshop' 111 students were participated.


5: Problem Encountered and Resources Required:-
